The University Statutes mandate the conduct of the Board of Studies at least once a year, in which modifications, improvements, and additions to the Course Structure and Syllabus are discussed. 4. The Academic Council reviews these suggestions and forwards the approved suggestions to the Board of Management for necessary endorsement. 5. The University adopts a Continuous Evaluation System to ensure the effective dissemination and assessment of knowledge, skills, and professional attitude among students.</p> <p>The examination system is implemented in accordance with the guidelines and norms prescribed by the respective statutory bodies such as Council of Architecture (COA), Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), Indian Nursing Council (INC), and other concerned regulatory authorities. For programmes governed by these statutory bodies, the rules and regulations prescribed by the respective apex bodies are followed and supersede any other institutional provisions wherever applicable.</p>

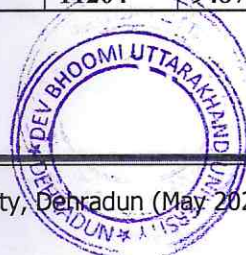

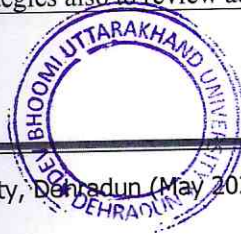
